
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Election Mechanism at BIET

At BIET the election process is inclusive, transparent, and accessible to all students, regardless of their backgrounds or affiliations. Additionally, providing support and resources to elected representatives can help them effectively fulfill their duties and serve the student body.



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Announcement and Nomination: The college administration or student government announces the upcoming class representative elections. Students interested in running for class representative typically nominate themselves or are nominated by their peers. Nominees may need to fulfill certain eligibility criteria, such as being enrolled in the specific class or program for which they are running.

Campaigning Period: Candidates campaign to gain support from their classmates. They may organize events, create campaign posters and flyers, utilize social media platforms, and engage in debates or public speeches to showcase their platforms and qualifications.

Voter Registration: To ensure the integrity of the election, students may be required to register as voters. This process may involve verifying student enrollment and eligibility to vote in the particular class or program.

Debates and Candidate Forums: Colleges often host debates or candidate forums where candidates can present their ideas, answer questions from their peers, and engage in discussions about relevant issues. These events provide an opportunity for students to make informed decisions about their votes.
